



XYLITOL IS LETHAL TO DOGS

Are you familiar with xylitol, the sugar replacement that's great for humans? Do you know that even the tiniest amount can kill dogs?

Ruby, a seven-year-old Hungarian Vizsla died after eating brownies made with xylitol. Like Ruby's owners, very few people are aware of the toxic effects xylitol has on dogs.



Xylitol is everywhere, and becoming increasingly popular in chewing gum, toothpaste, peanut butter, chewable medicines, cakes...

Look out for it! Just one piece of chewing gum IS enough to harm an 8-10kg dog.

Xylitol does not affect cats. But if any pet eats something you have concerns about, immediately call:

Save the APL number on your phone. For a fee of £35-£45 they will advise you what to do. Immediate action may save your pet's life.
